This picture was taken last March 2016 when the group first got together to form up a Conference Management Team (CMT). Over time, due to health issues, James Shapard has had to back out. In his place now is WSDSC Treasurer Van Scheppach as the business manager.

The CMT has been working hard over the ensuing months to prepare for the DSA 2017 Houston conference to occur April 2 - 9, 2017 at the Westin Galleria Hotel in Houston, TX. There, the team plans to market Early Bird Combo tickets, and to boost, sell them at a special rate for the month of April this year. A combo ticket, including DSA membership fee, program book, opening/closing ceremonies, workshops and exhibits, gala banquet, and evening entertainment, is priced at \$250 per person - a special rate, normally at \$270.00 for the duration of 2017. Beginning January 2018, the rate will be increased to \$320; January 1-June 30, 2019, \$370; and from July 1, 2019 on to the date of the conference, at the door \$420.

The CMT wishes to offer WSDSC members the same special rate at \$250 for the month of April. To take advantage of the real deal, look for the exciting launching of our new webpage, <u>dsa2019seattle.org</u>, to be ready anytime on or after the DSA 2017 Houston. The <u>wsdsc.org</u> will have this page that focuses on all our efforts in conference planning.

Be sure you stay well-informed of what is going on and pass on the good word about this special rate on your early bird combo tickets to all your friends. It may not be repeated.
